Identified stakeholder groups: 1 Administrator Group, 1 Board Representative Group, 4 Student Leadership Groups, 4 Teacher Leadership Groups, 1 Parent Leadership Group

Timeline

- Fall 2021: vetted 3 different vendors for titles, cost, etc.
- Week of February 14: email out to various groups; due date of February 25
- February 16 (Parent Advisory Committee): present options and allow parents to make recommendations
- February 24 (Student Advisory Committee): present options and allow students to make recommendations
- March 1: Recommendations and lists by grade finalized
- March 8 Board Meeting: Presentation and Approval for Purchase
